**ScottCares Foundation announces winners of 2nd Annual “Leaders of Tomorrow”
Stomp the Yard step show**

Winston-Salem, NC--- Making a difference one step at a time; local Greek organizations stepped up to the plate to honor leaders they admire and look up to at the ScottCares Foundation 2nd Annual “Leaders of Tomorrow” Stomp the Yard Step Show, held at Salem College, Friday, Feb. 6. They did so through traditional “stepping”, widely popular among African-American Greek Fraternities and Sororities.

“We are an organization that widely embraces all art forms,” said Scott Abdul-Salaam, founder and president of the local non-profit ScottCares Foundation. “We felt it would be great to bring the local colleges and Greek groups together to show off their talent and artistic skills, while at the same time, pay homage to leaders they feel have made a difference.”

Leaders in their own right, Abdul-Salaam wanted to prove that today’s college students are all “leaders of tomorrow”.

“... The time is coming when today’s youth will take over and rule the world, but it is our responsibility as the adults to prepare them to do so; therefore, we must be the role models who provide the proper guidance they need to achieve, and lead our future,” Abdul-Salaam added.

Hosted by Krishauna Hines-Gaither, coordinator of foreign languages at Salem College, and Sport-E-Odie, radio personality at WJMH 102 Jamz radio station, the 3-hour show featured competing Greek organizations such as Zeta Phi Beta from UNC-Greensboro; Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. and Tau Beta Sigma band sorority both from N.C.A&T State University; Kappa Kappa Psi band fraternity from Winston-Salem State University; Swing Phi Swing social sorority all the way from Bowie State University in Maryland, and Groove Phi Groove fraternity from Shaw University in Raleigh.

Intermission acts included Salem College’s step team, Ghost Riders; Parkland High School band’s drum line; Quashawn Hall, Parkland High junior who did an original spoken word piece; the

International Dance Club of Salem College, as well as local break dancers, B-Boy Collective, entertained the crowd with old-school hip hop poppin' and lockin' moves.

Step show winners are as follows:

1st place:

- Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity Inc., NC A&T.

Winners walked away with a trophy and \$400 cash prize to help support community programming.

2nd place:

Winners received a trophy each.
